He also gave of examples of the inspirational and caring qualities of the former staff at the School.

Steve Pettett introduced our new President, Tom Roberts and in his speech catalogued some of the many achievements of our new President together with examples of the service that he had given to the community.

Steve then proposed the toast to our new President while the regalia of office, the Shield and Cap, were presented by the retiring President for safe keeping through the coming year.

Tom Roberts gave a very entertaining response modestly comparing his own achievements with those of other former Presidents and Old Cestrefeldians.
